Volunteer Position Description

POSITION TITLE:

Agriculture & Natural Resources Volunteer Leader

TIME REQUIRED:

- Volunteer service will be provided as needed and requested by the ANR Agent
- One year (July 1 June 30)
- Meeting dates, times, location, and frequency are flexible based on the program, event, and educational opportunity

LOCATION:

Meetings may be held at the Extension office, a farm, or at another location or meeting place that is convenient and accessible for the program, group, event, or activity. Planning and preparation may be done at the Extension Office or at the volunteer leader's home.

GENERAL PURPOSE:

Assist the ANR Agent in planning, preparing, and delivering a program, event, or activity. Volunteer leaders will receive knowledge, information, and delivery skills related to Agriculture & Natural Resources that will improve the quality of life for them and their families.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Work with the ANR agent to coordinate programs, meetings, events, tours, and activities
- Assist in conducting educational or research projects, programs, events, meetings, or activities
- Provide leadership to ANR clientele when applicable
- The volunteer leader will be committed to helping clientele and producers be productive citizens by making a positive contribution to their farm, business, family, school, or community
- Work with the ANR agent and assist with the evaluation process as requested
- Follow all policies of the University of Kentucky Cooperative Extension Service

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Applicants must complete the volunteer application and screening process in the appropriate category level.
- Provide their own transportation to programs, meetings, events, and activities
- Self-starter; Must be able to work with minimal supervision from professional staff
- Effective communication skills with Extension Staff, volunteers, and program participants.
- A sincere interest in working with Extension staff, producers, volunteers, parents, and vouth
- Organizational skills; ability to organize information and materials in a timely manner

- The opportunity to work with producers, clientele, youth adults, providing positive learning, support, and growth experiences
- Receive intrinsic and extrinsic rewards at volunteer recognition events
- Volunteer development opportunities
- Opportunities to share your interests, skills, talents, and interests
